City Implements Additional Strategies to Help Slow the Spread of COVID-19

HAPPY VALLEY - In its continuing effort to slow the transmission of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Happy Valley, the City has decided to move to online and telephone services at City Hall for all departments. We recognize that this could be an inconvenience and did not make the decision lightly.

Effective immediately, and extending through further notice. City Hall is closed to walk-in customers. To continue to offer service in all other areas, we encourage people to:

- Use electronic submittal or Email (as applicable) for all permit applications.
- Make an appointment if you need an in-person consultation with an engineer, planner or plans examiner.
- All visitors must comply with social distancing. Anyone who is coughing, appears to have a fever, or is having difficulty breathing will be asked to return at a later time.
