SAFETY FIRST

For the safety of residents, businesses, and visitors to the City, temporary camping is only permitted in areas of public right-of-way between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Temporary camping is also solely permitted in commercial and industrial zones, where vehicles do not travel. Additionally, temporary camps must be located more than 100ft. from a residential area and more than 1,000ft. from a school.

All persons camping temporarily MUST comply with all laws and regulations.

NO PUBLIC URINATION
OR DEFECATION
NO PUBLIC NUISANCE
