

**CITY OF HAPPY VALLEY  
ORDINANCE NO. 575**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 9 PUBLIC PEACE AND WELFARE OF THE  
HAPPY VALLEY MUNICIPAL CODE**

WHEREAS, the City added Chapter 9.02 to the Happy Valley Municipal Code (Code) in June 2022 which added objectively reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on the acts of sitting, lying, sleeping, or keeping warm and dry outdoors; and

WHEREAS, temporary camping allowed at special events have their own requirements as set forth under Chapters 16.69 (temporary use permits) and Chapter 16.64 (conditional use permits); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to allow the certain temporary camping to be regulated under Chapters 16.69 and Chapter 16.64 and to be excluded from Chapter 9.02; and

WHEREAS, the City finds it is in the public interest to enact the changes to the Happy Valley Municipal Code as set forth in this Ordinance.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HAPPY VALLEY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** Chapter 9.02 Camping on Public and Private Property in the Happy Valley Municipal Code is amended as set forth in Exhibit A.

**Section 2.** This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage.

## EXHIBIT A

### Chapter 9.02

(Additions in *italics*, deletions in ~~striketrough~~)

#### **9.02.060 Restrictions on camping activity in temporary camp sites.**

A. When temporary camping is allowed in this chapter, all persons camping must comply with all laws and local regulations, including, but not limited to, those found in Happy Valley Municipal Code Titles 6, 8, 9, 10, and 12.

B. Except as expressly authorized by the Happy Valley Municipal Code, it shall be unlawful for any individual to store more than six square feet of camp paraphernalia in the public right-of-way or on public property during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

C. Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, the city manager may temporarily authorize camping or storage of personal property on public property by written order that specifies the period of time and location permitted:

1. In the event of emergency circumstances.

~~—2.— In conjunction with a special event permit.~~

3. Upon finding it to be in the public interest and consistent with council goals and policies.

#### **9.02.090 Exclusion.**

*A. The provisions of this Chapter 9.02 do not apply to camping or temporary camping that has been authorized through:*

*1. A temporary use permit under Section 16.69.010 of this code; or*

*2. A condition use permit under Chapter 16.64 of this code.*
