ABOUT HAPPY VALLEY'S PUBLIC SAFETY LEVY

THIS NOVEMBER, HAPPY VALLEY RESIDENTS WILL VOTE ON A FIVE-YEAR PUBLIC SAFETY LEVY TO DETERMINE IF THE CITY'S DEDICATED POLICE SERVICES WILL CONTINUE TO BE FUNDED.

WHO PROVIDES POLICE SERVICES FOR THE CITY?

Services are offered through a partnership with the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office (CCSO). Deputies are employees of the CCSO, but specifically assigned to Happy Valley.

WHY DOES THERE NEED TO BE A LEVY?

Unfortunately, there is simply not enough dollars in the General Fund to support police services. The levy is needed to ensure costs for dedicated police are covered.

IF THE LEVY DOESN'T PASS, WHAT HAPPENS TO HAPPY VALLEY POLICE?

If the levy fails, Happy Valley's dedicated police services will end and deputies will be reassigned to other areas. Residents can still call 9-1-1, but a deputy from the CCSO will respond WHEN AVAILABLE and ONLY for life threatening situations.

IS THIS REALLY ALL OR NOTHING?

Yes. Either Happy Valley receives dedicated police services or none at all.
