Meals on Wheels People: Delivering meals, connection, and compassion for more than 50 years

Please join <u>Meals on Wheels People</u> CEO Suzanne Washington to learn how we're changing the lives of seniors every day, one meal at a time. Suzanne will discuss the MOWP service model, how we work in Happy Valley, and how we're addressing the growing population and increasing needs of older adults in our community.

#### Suzanne Washington Biography:

Prior to joining Meals on Wheels People, Suzanne Washington worked for more than 25 years at Impact NW where her responsibilities included directing overall agency operations as well as establishing and managing strategic relationships to leverage long-term opportunities and support. Suzanne has a Bachelor of Science in education from the University of Oregon and a master's degree in psychology from United States International University. After starting her career as a teacher, coach, and professional basketball player in South America, Australia, and the U.S., Suzanne brought her international experience working with youth to Impact NW's Youth Service Center in 1987. Throughout her years of service at Impact NW she spearheaded the development of programs such as Richmond Place, Impact NW's transitional housing facility for homeless families; SUN School Programs; Youth Mentoring; and Bridges to Housing.

Suzanne was a volunteer representative payee for people with disabilities from 2007 to 2022. She was appointed by the governor to sit on the board of directors for the State of Oregon Patient Safety Commission and served from 2015 to 2020. Suzanne is a former board member for Meals on Wheels America and served as a member of the Oregon Hunger Task Force board from 2016 to 2022. She is currently the chair of the Medically Tailored Meals Coalition of Washington.

<u>Clackamas County Clerk</u>



#### **SESSION TOPIC:**

Office of the County Clerk: Elections, Recording, Records Management

During the early days of settlers, there were three elected positions: 1) the Sheriff to keep the peace 2) the Treasurer to keep the money 3) the Clerk to keep the records. The responsibility of each continues to this day.

The County Clerk Department oversees the Elections, Recording, and Records Management divisions. Responsible include election administration, organization and access to public records, recording all real property transactions, issuing marriage licenses, and even officiating weddings on Fridays.

The elections portion of the job includes 26 ballot drop sites that could collect many of the ballots from 320,000 registered Clackamas County voters in 16 incorporated cities. Catherine shared the process of ballot collection and recording, highlighting the integrity that goes into the process. She encouraged citizens to track their ballot and even invited those that wanted to visit the voting offices to watch it in person.

The Office of the Clerk ensures equitable and inclusive access to local government services through conducting accurate and transparent elections, empowering every voice, recording real property transactions, issuing marriage licenses, officiating weddings, and preserving the public record.

Joshua and Ben shared information about the proposed Recreation Center designed to serve the community. They went on to discuss their focus on being fiscally responsible for the initial phase of the project. They also discussed what would happen if the bond measure were to pass as well as options if it did not pass.

#### **What Is Being Proposed?**

This November, Happy Valley voters will have the opportunity to consider Bond Measure 3-626, a proposal to fund the construction of a Community Center on city-owned property near 172nd Avenue and the Scouters Mountain roundabout.

The proposed bond measure is \$50 million. If passed, the property tax rate is estimated to be increased by \$0.51 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The tax revenue would be used for building a facility with recreation, aquatics, and gathering spaces for community use.

If the measure is passed, construction is expected to begin in the Spring of 2026 and finish in 2028.

#### What Happens If the Measure **Does Not Pass?**

- » The City would not move forward with construction of the Community Center at this time.

» Property taxes would not be increased.

Plans for the proposed facility based on community input would include:

- · Indoor recreation pool
- · Multi-purpose gym
- · Walking and jogging track
- · Group fitness and exercise rooms
- · Weight and cardio spaces
- · Community room with catering kitchen
- · Reservable gathering space
- · Space for child watch

#### **Estimated Cost to Property Owners**

- » \$0.51 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.
- For a typical home in Happy Valley with a market value of \$660,000 and an assessed value of \$360,000, the estimated cost would
